

Oówa Kiŋ He Khilí Yeló - Š

Today, we are going to learn š. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, "še" uŋspéuŋkič'ičhiyapi kte.

š – "še"

š makes a š sound – "še" léčhel eyápi: šššššššš

Can you say š? – "še" ehá oyákihi he?

š – "šššššššš"

We use š to spell šúnka (dog). – "še" uŋ "šúnka" uŋkówapi uŋkókihipi.

It's also used to spell šá (red) and šíča (bad) – Nakúŋ "šá" na "šíča" uŋ owápi

I have a dog. – Šúnka waŋ bluhá.

Last year she had puppies. – Héкта ómakħa uŋ héhaŋ šuŋħpála wičháyuha.

She had six puppies! – Šuŋħpála šákpe wičháyuha!

That's a lot of puppies! – Líla šuŋħpála ótapi!

Maybe next year I will get a monkey. – Uŋgnáš thókáta ómakħa kiŋ šúnka
wičháša waŋzí iwáču kte séče.

š – "še"
