Today, we are going to learn the letter Pǎ. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, “pǎ” unspéuŋkič’ičhiyapi kte.

Pǎ – “pǎ”

Pǎ makes a pǎǎǎǎǎ sound – “pǎ” léčhel eyápi: pǎǎǎǎǎ

Can you say Pǎ? – “pǎ” ehá oyákihi he?

Pǎ – “pǎǎǎǎǎ”

Pǎ is the first letter in the word “fire” – “pǎ” un “pǎéta” unkwápi unkwókihipi.

And “porcupine” or “grass” – Na “pǎahíŋ” naiŋš “pǎeži”.

Also “head” – Na nakúŋ “pǎ”.

Yesterday my head did not feel well. – Ĥtálehaŋ líla “pǎ” mayázaŋ.

Mother said I was sick. – Iná makhúža kéya omákiyake.

She felt my “forehead” and took my temperature. – “Pǎ ” kiŋ émapathŋ na kǎal’ímayutǎe.

My “nose” was dripping with “snot.” – “Pǎsú” etáŋhaŋ áta “pǎamnís’e” mahíyu.

I did not feel good at all. – Líla omáphi šni.

But then mother gave me some “medicine.” – Yuŋkháŋ iná “pǎežúta” eyá mak’ú.

After some time, I felt much better. – Watóhaŋ yuŋkháŋ ečhel imáyaye.
