

## Oówa kiŋ hé khilí yeló! - Ph

Today, we are going to learn the letter Ph. – **Aŋpétu kiŋ lé “phi” uŋspéuŋkič’ičhiyapi kte.**

Ph – **“phi”**

Ph makes a phhhhhhi sound – **“phi” léchel eyápi: phhhhhhi**

Can you say Ph? – **“phi” ehá oyákihi he?**

Ph – **“phhhhhhi”**

Ph is the first letter in the word “elephant” – **“phi” uŋ “phuté wókič’u” uŋkówapí uŋkókihipi.**

And “upper lip” – **Na “phuté”.**

Also “thank you” – **Na nakúŋ “philámayaye”.**

“Thank you” is what you say when someone does something nice for you or helps you.

– **Tuwá takúŋl ečháníčičuŋ naiŋš tóškhe óničiye háŋtaŋš, “philámayaye” eyákiye.**

When uncle “repaired” mother’s car she said... – **Lekší iná tša iyéčhiŋkiŋyaŋke kiŋ**

**“phikíčičiye” uŋ héhaŋ...**

Thank you! – **“Philámayaye!” ekíye.**

When mother trimmed grandpa’s “mustache” he said... – **Iná kaká “phuthíŋhiŋ” kiŋ kíčičašla uŋ héhaŋ...**

Thank you! – **“Philámayaye!” ekíye.**

It’s a simple way to show you appreciate someone! – **Héchel šna “wóphila”**

**uŋkíčhiyatháŋiŋpi.**

Thank you, Ph! – **“Philámayaye” ló, “phi”!**

Ph – **“phi”**
