Today, we are going to learn the letter In. – **Anpétu kiŋ lé, "in" unspéunċiċ'ičhiyapi kte.**

In – **“in”**

In makes a *inny* sound – **“in” léčhel eyápi: inny**

Can you say In? – **“in” ehá oyákihi he?**

In – **“inny”**

In is the first letter in the word “lava” – **“in” un “inyanšlo” unċówapi unċókihipi.**

And “to run” – **Naínš “inyanċa”**

Also “stone” – **Na nakún “inyan”**

I like to collect stones! – **Ínyan mnayán awáštewalake!**

There are many different kinds of stones. – **Ínyan líla očháže óta waštewalake.**

Like “diamonds.” – **“Ínyan othéċhika” kiŋ iyótaŋwala.**

And “turquoise.” – **Na nakún “Ínyan thó” eyápi hená.**

They look so cool! – **Hená áta khilíya wiyáċpakpa naínš šlušlúte!**

Sometimes I collect plain stones. – **Nahán tuktélšna inyan ikčéka wapáhi.**

I use my “slingshot” to shoot them over the fence. – **Na šná “inyan ičáċmuŋ” un ċhúnċaške isáŋpċha iyéwaye.**
