

Tóškhe mnińúha wóžuha uŋ tńaté kańwógyapi káǵapi

How to make a paper bag kite. – **Tóškhe mnińúha wóžuha uŋ tńaté kańwógyapi káǵapi.**

Is there a breeze outside? – **Tńaŋkál tńaté hiyú he?**

Then it's a good day to fly a kite! – **Héyeča héči, tńaté kańwógyapi waŋží kiŋyéuŋkhiyapi kta iyéčeča.**

Step 1: Open the paper bag and fold in the top edge. – **Wóečuŋ tńokáhe: Mnińúha wóžuha waŋží iću na yuǵáŋ na waŋkátanhan mathéte kiŋ yukhípaža yo/ye.**

Step 2: Tape a long string on the inside of each corner. – **Wóečuŋ ićinuŋpa: Imáhel okáńmiŋla ečhekče hańúŋta háŋskaska aiyaskabya yo/ye.**

Step 3: Tie the four strings together. – **Wóečuŋ ićiyamni: Hańúŋta tópa k'uŋ ićhiyakaška yo/ye.**

Step 4: Color the bag with your favorite colors! – **Wóečuŋ ićítopa: Wóžuha kiŋ tókčhiŋka oówa tóna uŋ wíyuŋ wo/we.**

Step 5: Tape colorful streamers (or ribbons) on the bottom end of the bag. – **Wóečuŋ ićízaptan: Wápańlate ówaŋyaŋ waštéšte ikńówagyŋ na ečhel ań'áyethuŋ wo/we.**

Good job! – **Wašté yeló/kštó – tanjáŋ ečhanuŋ!**

Time to test it out! – **Waná uŋkíyuthapi kte!**

Wow look at it fly! – **Wáŋ/Má, yuphíya kiŋyé ló/kštó!**
