

## Oówa kiŋ Hé Khilí Yeló! - A

Today, we are going to learn the letter A. – **Aŋpétu kiŋ lé, "a" uŋspéuŋkič'ičhiyapi kte.**

A – “a”

A makes a \_\_\_\_\_ sound – “a” léčhel eyápi: aaa.

Can you say A? – “a” ehá oyákihi he?

A – “aaa”

A is the first letter in the word “bread” – “a” uŋ **aǵúyapi** uŋkówapi uŋkókihipi.

And “bald eagle” or “ribbon” – Na **anúŋkǵasaŋ** naíŋš **apáǵlate.**

Also “lizard” – Na **nakúŋ** **agléška.**

I found a baby lizard once. It was injured and left alone. – **Watóhaŋl** **agléška** waŋ úŋtǵuŋ čha **iyéwaye. Áta išnála yeló.**

Mom said I could nurse it back to health. – **Iná omákiyakiŋ** na asníwaya owákihi kéye.

But I observed that baby lizards are not like human babies. – **Yuŋkǵáŋ** awábleze ečhíyatanhaŋ **agléška** kiŋháŋ **hokšíčala** kičhí íčhitǵokečapi.

They don't like diapers or baby bottles. – **Aléža** na **aziŋpi** kiŋ waštélakapi šni.

But eventually it was strong again. – **Éyaš** haŋkéya taŋyáŋ ahí-la.

When it was time to return it to its home, I cheered it on. – **Heháŋl** **bluškíŋ** na **khihúŋni** eháŋl **awákiš'a yeló.**

Live well little lizard! – **Agléškala,** taŋyáŋ úŋ wo!
