

## Oówa kiŋ he khilí yeló - P

Today, we are going to learn the letter P. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, "pu" uŋspéuŋkič'ičhiyapi kte.

P – “pu”

P makes a \_\_\_\_\_ sound – "pu" léčhel eyápi: p

Can you say P? – "pu" ehá oyákihi he?

P – “p”

P is the first letter in the word “otter” – “pu” uŋ “ptáŋ” uŋkówapi uŋkókihipi

And “onion” or “snowshoes” – Na “pšíŋ” naiŋš “psaóhaŋpi”

Also “prairie dog” – Na nakúŋ “pispíza”

I like watching the prairie dogs on the “hillside” – “Pahá hepíya” él pispíza kiŋ waŋwíčhayaŋg maŋká awáštewalake.

They always “burrow” in the ground – Líglila šna makhá pablúpi.

Sometimes they “jump” when they run – Na watóhaŋl šna psípsil íŋyaŋkapi.

If I could, I would catch one in a “basket” – Owákihi háŋtaŋš waŋží psawógnake él oblúspiŋ kte.

Hey! I caught one! – Wáŋ! Waŋží oblúspe!
