

Oówa kiŋ hé khilí yeló! - Th

Today, we are going to learn the letter Th. – Anpétu kiŋ lé “thi” unspéunċiċ’ičhiyapi kte.

Th – “thi”

Th makes a thhhhhii sound – “thi” léčhel eyápi: **thhhhhii**

Can you say Th? – “thi” ehá oyákíhi he?

Th – “thhhhhii”

Th is the first letter in the word “to love someone” – “thi” un “theńíla” unċówapi unċókíhipi.

And “shell” or “dragonfly” – Na “thukíha” naíŋš “thuswéča”.

Also “house” – Na nakúŋ “thípi”.

Let me show you around my “house”! – “Thípi” waŋ él wathí kiŋ lé čhičípazo kte!

This is my room! I like it because it is very “roomy”. – Mithóŋpaye kiŋ lé é! “Thiyóthañkaya” čha wašté yeló.

This is our living room with a green “wall.” – Oásnikiye unċíthawapi léł “thitháhepiya” kiŋ thózi.

This is our kitchen. – Olól’iň’aŋ unċíthawapi kiŋ lé é.

Grandma likes to hang plants from the “ceiling.” – Unċí wathó waštéšte “thičhé” etañhaŋ šna otkéye.

Let’s go “downstairs” to the basement. – Waná “thihúkhutakiya” ačhíyŋ kte.

(*crickets*) – (*thiyóšlola*)

Never mind, I’m headed for the “door.” – Hiyá, ečhánleš “thiyópa” ektá miglóaye.

Th – “thi”
