

Oówa kiŋ he khilí yeló - U

Today, we are going to learn the letter U. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, "u" unspéunkič'ichiyapi kte.

U – “u”

U makes a _____ sound – “u” léchel eyápi: *uuu*

Can you say U? – “u” ehá oyákihi he?

U – “u”

U is the first letter in the word “acorn” – “u” un “úta” unkwápi unkwókihipi.

Also “Barn Swallow”. – Na nakúŋ “upízata”.

You know what? – Táku ochíciyakiŋ kte.

There aren't a lot of nouns that start with the letter U – “u” un wičhóiyé líla óta owápi šni.

But we can see the letter U mixed in other words. – Hó éyaš wičhóiyé óta él, “u” waŋží yaŋké.

In the word “dice”, U comes at the end of the word. – “Kħaŋsú” eyápi kiŋ hé él, “u” waŋ yaŋké, iháŋke ektá.

Also “seed” or “bone.” – Naháŋ “sú” naiŋš “huhú” eyápi kiŋ hená él.

I broke a bone once. – Watóhaŋl huhú waŋ makáweŋe.

I was playing soccer. – Tħabnákwápi waškáte.

Another player and I bumped “chest.” – Tuwá kičhí “makhú” ičhiyamapħa.

I fell back on a rock and broke my “leg.” – Yuŋkháŋ íŋyaŋ waŋ kašémayiŋ na un “hú” makáweŋe.

It hurt a lot! – Heháŋl hú kiŋ líla mayázaŋ!

Luckily the “doctor” could fix it and I could play soccer again. – Hó éyaš wámaphike; “wašíču wakħáŋ” kiŋ aphímičičhiyiŋ na heháŋl akhé tħabnákwápa owákihi.

I'm coming guys! – Hókahe, waná waú!
