

Oówa kiŋ he khilí yeló - E

Today, we are going to learn the letter E. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, "e" unspéuŋkič'ičhiyapi kte.

E – “e”

E makes a _____ sound – "e" léchel eyápi: *ehhh*

Can you say E? – "e" ehá oyákihi he?

E – “e”

Guess what! There aren't a lot of words that start with the letter E. – Eyá, wóihake éyaš “e” un wičhóiyé líla óta owápi šni.

But we can find E at the end of many words. – Hó éyaš wičhóiyé óta él, “e” waŋží yaŋké, iháŋke-ta.

Like “Mountain” – “Hé” eyápi kiŋ hé él, “e” waŋ yaŋké.

And “Father.” – Na “até” eyápi kiŋ hé él.

My Father likes to take me hiking. – Até kičhí h́eyáta omáwani s'a.

I like to see our “footprints” in the dirt. – Makháblu él “oyé” awátuŋwe.

Once we saw a “horn” on the side of the trail. – Watóhaŋl, očháŋku aglágla, “ptehé” waŋ iyéuŋyaŋpi.

It had some “blood” on it. – “Wé” eyá óha čha awábleze.

Father told me to leave it. – Éyaš até ayúštaŋ maší.

I wonder what happened there... – Hél táku tókha sél.

E – “e”
