

## Oówa kiŋ Hé Khilí Yeló! - N

Today, we are going to learn the letter N. – Anpétu kiŋ lé, “na” unspéuŋkič’ičhiyapi kte.

N – “na”

N makes a \_\_\_\_\_ sound – “na” - léchel eyápi: nna

Can you say N? – “na” - chá oyákihi he?

N – “nna”

N is the first letter in the word pronghorn. – “na” un niǵésaŋla unkwapi unkwókihipi.

And motorcycle or swimsuit – Na napǰópǰopela, naiŋš nuŋwáŋ hayápi.

Also ring. – Na nakúŋ napsíyoǰli.

My Aunt wears a lot of rings – Tǰuŋwíŋwaye kiŋ napsíyoǰli óta úŋ.

When she dresses up she puts on a skirt and lots of jewelry – Aphíič’iya čháŋšna, nitéhepi waŋží kič’úŋ na šna ažú wiyákpakpa óta nakúŋ.

Her hand has a bracelet and rings on her fingers. – Napé él napókaške úŋ na napsíyoǰli tóna nakúŋ.

At least 2! – Núŋpa, naiŋš hé isáŋmya!

But if it’s cold you don’t see any of that with her “gloves” on – Éyaš osní háŋtaŋš, nape kiŋ waŋyáŋg-phičá šni, ičhíŋ napíŋkpa kǰó úŋ.

You look nice Aunty! – Áta nikhíli, Tǰuŋwíŋ!
